

# SAMPLE LESSON PLAN







# **DRAMATIC PLAY**

**ACTIVITY:** Build a "barn" area with plush farm animals.

**ACTIVITY:** Set up a "feed the animals" station with pretend food and animal figures.

**ACTIVITY:** Role-play as farm animals with animal masks and props.

## **BLOCKS**

**ACTIVITY:** Build a simple farm with blocks, including a barn and pens for animals. **MATERIALS:** Large, soft blocks in various shapes and sizes.

**ACTIVITY:** Create animal "tracks" for animals to follow.

# **LITERATURE**

**ACTIVITY:** Reading corner with a variety of farm themed hard (infant) books and plush animals.

#### **ART**

**ACTIVITY:** Create farm animal art using animal stickers on paper. **ACTIVITY:** Farm animal rubber stamping on paper with a barn print. **ACTIVITY:** Vegetable prints using potatoes, broccoli bell peppers, etc **ACTIVITY:** Cotton ball sheep where children glue cotton balls to a black sheep cut out.

## **CIRCLE TIME**

**ACTIVITY:** Sing "Old MacDonald Had a Farm" and use animal puppets to represent each animal.

**ACTIVITY:** Read "Feed The Farm" by Little Hippo Books, focusing on how farmers feed animals.

**ACTIVITY:** Listen to and mimic farm animal sounds using a sound book or toy.

**ACTIVITY:** Read "Hello Farm" by Amy Pixtonand act out the animals' movements.

**ACTIVITY:** Read "On The Farm" by Bright Baby, focusing on the sounds and activities of the animals. **ACTIVITY:** Read "Farm Sounds" by Usborne Books by Doreen Cronin and discuss the animals' movements

## **STEM**

and actions

**ACTIVITY:** Explore animal sounds using the Book Around the Farm by Eric Carle

**ACTIVITY:** Simple cause and effect with farm animal sound toys (pressing buttons to hear different sounds).

# **MANIPULATIVES**

**ACTIVITY:** Animal shape sorting with large, soft animal shapes.

**ACTIVITY:** Farm animal puzzles with pieces that fit together to form complete animals.

**ACTIVITY:** Match animal sounds to pictures of the animals.

## LARGE MOTOR

**ACTIVITY:** "Animal Parade" where children mimic the movements of different farm animals (e.g., hopping like a bunny, waddling like a duck).

**ACTIVITY:** "Animal Sound Dance" where children move to the rhythm of different animal sounds.
